From the Pastor's desk.

WHEN IS YOUR BIRTHDAY?

Mine is November 14. Dossie's is February 13. Those are fixed dates. Same day each year. The birthday of the church is Pentecost, fifty days after Easter. It falls on a different day every year owing to the way we calculate the date for Easter. Easter itself is the first Sunday after the first full moon after the first day of Spring.

When is your birthday over Mine ends at midnight on November 14. A few times, I have celebrated Dossie's birth week or even her birth month. But eventually, the celebrating ends.

When does Easter end? We change the parament cloths on Pentecost, but that just means we have moved into a different season of the church year.

I think the answer to my question is never, or at least not until Christ returns. The tomb is still empty after all and Christ is alive today. So it's still Easter.

Now for the harder part. If it is still Easter, and I believe it is, How should we then live? (*Apologies to Francis Schaeffer*)

If you are a Christian, and I assume you are, **shouldn't we all live expecting Jesus to return?** The first disciples went fishing. At first glance it seems like an odd thing to do. They had seen the resurrected Jesus, and the best thing they could think of was to go fishing?

What if we took off our modern glasses for a moment and thought like first century believers? How do you make sense of things that make no sense? I like to ride my motorcycle. I have solved a lot of my problems with nothing but the wind blowing through my hair, I mean through my helmet. Fishing does the same thing for me. I lived for eight years in Elberton and went fishing every week that the weather permitted, and several that didn't permit. I have left tons of my issues in Lake Russell.

Maybe, just maybe, the disciples followed Peter out on the boat to have a sense of normalcy and routine. They had a routine night fishing, it was just a BAD night. They came close to the shore and Jesus appeared to them, for the third time. Jesus has them put their nets down and the catch of fish is amazing, miraculous even.

Peter remembers this exact scene from the early days and he leaps out of the boat to reach Jesus. This is the scene where Jesus asks Peter three times if he loves Him. Peter answers, not fully, but he answers and Jesus tells him to feed and tend Jesus' sheep.

I believe Easter challenges us to give our old selves a decent burial and to walk away from that decaying body. I believe we MUST embrace the new creature that we all are in Christ and live as shepherds of the flock of Jesus.

A shepherd is sold out to caring for his sheep. He is willing to die for the flock. Isn't this what Jesus meant when he told the disciples to love each other, not as the world loves, but as Jesus loves?

My answer to the question of what happens after Easter, is that there is no such thing as after Easter. It is always Easter and we are all continuously being resurrected.


I will end with the question asked of us at our ordination.


