From the Pastor

I'm writing this on Memorial Day and I am doing my best to be a caregiver for Dossie right now, as she recuperates from having her shoulder replaced.

I think I've said this before, but I'm not really a fan of what Christmas has become. Christmas is supposed to be about the greatest gift that the world has ever been given and instead it has been hijacked to represent a crazy capitalistic attempt at making a profit for the year. I love Christmas. I just hate what Christmas has become. Unfortunately, I think the same thing has either happened or is happening to Memorial Day. I remember hearing and seeing the older members of the church I grew up in decorating the graves of soldiers when I was a little boy. Memories are always suspect, but I knew what Decorations Day was before I was a teenager specifically, because my Church was faithful in making sure that the graves of fallen soldiers were not forgotten. As I was watching TV, I realized that Memorial Day is being hijacked or has been hijacked as the unofficial start to summer. I think there was more news about how to grill and what to grill than about the men and women who died so that we could have a day when we might grill.

I watched an interview with a bunch of high school and college students on a beach in Florida. They were asked what was Memorial Day about? None of them got the answer, correct.

Memorial day honors those who gave their lives in service to our country. It's not a hill I want to die on, but in a lot of places, it says those who were killed in combat. I know too many people who were grievously wounded on the battlefield, but didn't die of their wounds until years later. I honor their sacrifice on Memorial Day.

May 22, and we got home from the hospital about 3 o'clock. Dossie was sleepy and drugged and I was afraid to leave the room just in case she decided she could get up and walk away. Around 5 o'clock one of Summerville's members delivered food. It was a tremendous blessing and one that used to be fairly common, at least in the south. Sadly, I think this tradition is being hijacked for several reasons in our modern society. But for everyone who is involved in Summerville First United Methodist Church, I encourage you to take advantage of this ministry if you have a family member who is having surgery. I could go on and on about how good the food is, but most of you already know that, and it would take away from the fact that it is a ministry, and it is a service to God.

Some of you will think, "I wouldn't want to put anybody out. Besides, I can always have something delivered." This misses the point; we are a family at church. I say every week, if you won't allow others to serve God by serving you, you rob them of their blessing. This tradition has its roots in the first months after Jesus' death. The apostles feed the widows and orphans. So, it must have been important to Jesus because his disciples made it a priority.

For me, this all flows into and out of Jesus' command to "Love one another, as I have loved you, so must you love one another."

The last leg of the stool for this month is a thank you to all who brought food, flowers and especially to those who sent cards of holy love. No one seems to send actual cards or letters anymore and I know for a fact that it is special to hold a card or letter that a loved one has actually held in their hands. That is a very special ministry and it blesses many people.
