








Drew and Rachel are expecting a baby girl. We enjoyed celebrating the expected birth during a baby shower on April 14th.

Cheryl and Elaine volunteer once a month to prepare food and serve at the kitchen. The next date to volunteer is May 16, 9 a.m. until noon. You are invited to go help. The kitchen is located at 4 Calhoun Avenue NE, Rome, Georgia.









There is also a shower and washing facility. The public can get one load of clothes washed and dried once a week. They may also take a shower once a week. The facility is open Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. until noon.

From the Pastor's desk.

I sit here today and I am sad and I'm grieving and at the same time I'm joyous. Just two months ago, I was talking with some friends and I made a comment that there was no reason my mom couldn't live to be 100 years old. About three weeks ago, she went to the hospital with an irregular heartbeat and arrhythmia, and it has been downhill since then. She actually went home after the first week and she seemed to be doing better. Then last Saturday her heart went back into the abnormal rhythm and as I sit here this morning it is very doubtful that she will see her birthday on June 1. I'm sad and quite frankly feeling sorry for myself because I didn't see her as much as I should have. We talked a lot on the phone but life just kept getting in the way.

But I am very sincerely joyous because my mother has been incomplete since my dad passed in 2015. I didn't realize how deeply in love the two of them were until dad died. Every time I talked to mom on the phone she voiced how much she missed her husband. Saturday evening mom said that she was ready to go home to be with Jesus. And I am confident that's where she's headed. So while I'm sad, right now I cling to the promise made to us as Christians that there is a resurrection and a reunion coming.

The first Church I ever served was in Epworth, Georgia in Fannin county. The big fundraiser for the ministerial Association was a Labor Day barbecue. The pastors cooked and I got to participate in that several years. One of those years I was scheduled to do a funeral for someone who was very close to me. One of the pastors noticed I was a little down and asked about it. When I told him what was going on, I expected him to empathize with me, but no! He very correctly pointed out that if we really believed the things that we claim to believe to each other, we would cry when children were born and have a celebration when folks went home to be with their Lord and Savior.

It's not solely a function of being older, but I have come to realize that one of two things happen to most of us and it's usually the latter. God can, and does cure people. I have seen people come out of the hospital that doctors had said were not coming out, that there was nothing medical science could do for them. God cured them. I absolutely believe and have seen those miraculous cures. But I also absolutely believe that in most cases, God heals all of us by taking us home to be with him. As long as my mother is drawing breath, I will pray for her curing. But when I know that she has breathed her last breath whenever that is, I will praise God for healing her. I claim the resurrection. I firmly believe that at some point, I will see my mom and dad again. My mom will not have an irregular heartbeat, and my dad will not have emphysema. I'm going to close with a paraphrase of Martin Luther. This I believe, I stand here on the promise of God! I can do nothing else.
