From the Pastor

Recently, I had some serious dental work done. In one sitting, I had a wisdom tooth pulled, and a crown installed. As I have been recuperating, I have had an opportunity to think about life.

The wisdom tooth had to be pulled because of the way it came in. In short, it was beyond my control. I will be the first one to admit that I was anxious about having the tooth pulled primarily because I don't like pain. In the days immediately preceding the visit, I worried myself sick thinking about the potential pain. In reality, the pain was not nearly as bad as I feared.

With all the time I had to think, what I discovered was that much of life is like this experience. It is actually out of our control, and if we spend too much of our time, fearing what is coming, we will miss many of the opportunities God presents us.

Many of the situations in our life are like my wisdom tooth. It was out of my control. Nothing I did would have changed anything. Over the years, I have walked with people who lost a job due to plant closure, people who lost a loved one with no advance warning, people who experienced fire or flood. In each of these situations, trusting God is the only realistic response. I'm not dismissing the pains and griefs involved, and I recognize many of us want to make things better. I agree we must do our part. If your plant closes, you need to actively look for a new job. But, you are not alone and it helps to remember that God is with us through the storms of our lives.

The crown I got was a result of the failure of an old filling. I couldn't do anything about the filling failing, but, I could have taken better care of my teeth in the past and I wouldn't have needed the crown.

In our lives, we make choices. Each of us is where we are today as a direct result of the choices we have made; good or bad. We cannot change the past, but we can honor God by including Him in the choices we make.

Honoring God can be simple. When you are young, stay in school, actually get an education, save some of every check you get, get married and stay married before having a family. It's not always simple, stay away from people and circumstances that do not have your best interest at heart. It can be hard to walk away from a "friend" who does not use good judgement, but not doing so can lead you to places you DO NOT want to be.

Let these two verses speak into your situations.

Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. Philippians 4:6

Always pray. Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Philippians 4:8 Always think and include God .


